NOTES: Having trouble paying parking or traffic tickets, muni or bart citations, water/sewer, ambulance or child support bills? Discounts are available to help pay your fine, fee, or ticket for people with low incomes or people experiencing homelessness in San Francisco. The city is offering social services, a one-time free removal of all open tickets on one vehicle, community services in lieu of ticket payment, removal of late penalties, or monthly payment plans.

NOTES: San Francisco's rental assistance program can cover rent for up to 6 months for the months of April 2021 onward, but is being prioritized for certain populations. If your landlord attempts to evict you despite these protections, Open Door Legal can defend you. If you are served with a summons and complaint, you should seek out help immediately, as you only have 5 business days to file an answer.

Emergency-related side trips on the way home are permitted, including picking up a sick child at school or daycare, filling a prescription at a pharmacy, or stopping at an ATM for cash to pay the taxi driver.
